1.0 Report Overview

The Mission Empowerment Conference 2016 (the "Conference") was planned and executed by IMPACT Missionary Movement in conjunction with Seventh-Day Adventists Student Missionaries (SASM) and Students Missionaries Movement (STuMM). The conference took place from 1-5 July 2016 at the New Government Complex and NIPA Conference Centre. The Theme for the Conference was; *COME UP HIGHER*. The conference was led by 15 speakers of which 12 led different seminars focused primarily on missions. The conference was attended by an average of 780 delegates with maximum attendance on Sabbath reaching 1,000. The delegates at the conference represented 15 countries and of 4 continents. At the End of the Conference 18 precious souls were baptized. The Conference was followed by a mission which was organized for the delegates and was attended by 32 missionaries. A further 27 Souls were baptized bringing the total number of baptisms to 45.

1.1 Registration Report

Registration and Attendance

The Registered paid up delegates were 620 in total and the average attendance during the conference was around 780. The average numbers for each day were as follows; Friday 950, Saturday 1,250, Sunday 600, Monday 650 and Tuesday 550.

Countries Represented

The countries represented at this conference included Netherlands, Philippians, USA, Nigeria, Ghana, Kenya, Botswana, Zimbabwe, Swaziland, Malawi, Namibia, Angola, Lesotho and South Africa giving a total of 15 countries including Zambia.

Composition of Delegates

The composition of the delegates was encouraging as it consisted of missionaries, evangelists, Adventist youths, campus ministries, AY structures and a few non-Adventists. About 30 pastors were in attendance as well. The ratio of students to working members was about 5 to 1 i.e. about 600 students to 180 non-working members.

Mission Groups Represented

The following mission groups were officially present: SASM from University of Zambia, STuMM-Copperbelt University, Mission Cohort- South Africa, Reapers from Cape Town-South Africa, 1,000 missionary movement-ASIA, Mission Caleb-Namibia, ALIVE Nigeria, COME-Ghana, Rusangu Missions (RuMM)- Rusangu University, IMPACT Zimbabwe, ARMY South Africa, and Medical Missionary Movement Zambia, bringing the total number of mission groups to 12.

1.2 Financial Report

The budget for the conference was pegged at ZMW 250,000 which was fully met and exceeded.

Income

Income came from three sources which were registration fees, IMPACT coffers and donations both kind and in monetary form. See the tabulation below for income raised:

Programing


