About IMPACT

IMPACT Missionary Movement, is an organization instituted for preaching of the Gospel of the kingdom to all the nations through the leading and enabling power God through the Holy Spirit.

IMPACT is an acronym which stands for Inspired Missionaries Proclaiming the Advent of Christ Today. The movement consists of mainly youths – students and young professionals working with older members who seek to prepare the world for the imminent return of Jesus Christ.

Objectives

- To intentionally build leadership capabilities among members through biblically sound methodologies.
- To mobilize, train and involve Seventh - Day Adventists in ministry.
- To inspire individuals to spiritual, professional, academic, social and moral excellence.
- To aid the Seventh-Day Adventist Church in planting congregations in un-entered and semi-entered areas and ministering to unreached people groups.
- To promote practical religion through acts of compassion e. g. health support services, community service.

Brief Background

IMPACT was started on 4th October 2008 at Lusaka Central SDA Church in the then Central Zambia Conference; envisioned and founded by young Seventh - Day Adventists in Lusaka, Zambia.

In 2009, IMPACT undertook 9 missions in different parts of Zambia, trained over 70 young people for mission work; saw over 1,000 souls won and baptized to Christ, ministered and preached to more than 10,000 people, visited and fed hundreds of patients, changed hundreds of lives and gave birth to other young adult missionary movements.

As of 2017, IMPACT had undertaken over 62 short-term missions in different parts of Zambia, in partnership with organised Church structures; reaching over 120,000 people and over 3,520 souls baptised in to Christ. The movement had also planted 15 Churches across Zambia and sent 4 Missionaries beyond Zambia on Long term Missions. The Movement has an active membership of over 353 young Seventh-Day Adventist full time and part time Missionaries.

Structure

IMPACT began as a single entity registered as Supporting Ministry at Lusaka Central Seventh-Day Adventist Church. In 2015, IMPACT was adopted as a Supporting Ministry to the Lusaka Conference.

The movement has since restructured to have a National Board, National Executive and Chapter Executive committees in the Conferences. Currently, IMPACT has three Chapters: Lusaka, Midlands and Namibia. Membership is help by the Chapters.

The Movement is in the process of growing to have an executive to cover the Southern Africa-Indian Ocean Division of the Church and beyond.

Strategic Approach

IMPACT seeks to reach the world and we realize this is a mammoth task thus we have formulated strategies that will bring acceleration in the sharing of the gospel.

The movement is employing the strategy of total member involvement which is an emphasis on involvement of every member in evangelism wherever they are in their sphere of influence by helping members identify their spiritual gift and exploiting them.

Short term missions to semi-entered and un-entered areas have been primary means of evangelism for IMPACT, and the movement will continue with these but is also transitioning into doing urban missions as well.

To reach beyond the jurisdiction of its three chapters, IMPACT partners with the Church in various Conferences to conduct missions across Zambia and beyond while continuing to open Chapters across Africa

Furthermore, IMPACT has created strategic partnerships and affiliations with missionary movements across Africa, Asia and the United States of America to meet the call of the great commission to teach all nations. Currently, IMPACT is recruiting missionaries for training and long term missions to Asia under the auspices of the 1000 Missionary Movement of the North Asia Division of the Seventh-Day Adventist Church.

IMPACT is also moving towards long term missions using the plant 100 Churches a Year project, the running of a Bible School and networking and revival through Mission Empowerment Conferences that are aimed at empowering young people to be missionaries wherever they are. The Mission Empowerment Conference, held every two years is aimed at reaching people from across Sub-Saharan Africa and beyond.
